QUORUM/CALL TO ORDER

A quorum being present (Chair Barfield, Vice Chair Ley, Trustees Chan, Mizumoto, and Yap), Chair Barfield called the regular meeting of the Board of Trustees (Board) of the Employees' Retirement System of the State of Hawaii (ERS) to order at 10:15 a.m. and requested each Trustee identify themselves and confirm that they are the only ones present at their remote

location while attending the meeting. Each of the Trustees present confirmed same.

On a motion made by Trustee Mizumoto, seconded by Trustee Chan, and unanimously carried, to be able to hold a meeting closed to the public and allow Trustees to participate by teleconference or other remote meeting technology, pursuant to Act 220, Hawaii Session Laws 2021, and the Governor of the State of Hawaii's Emergency Proclamation Related to COVID-19 (Omicron Variant), dated January 26, 2022, in order to implement social distancing measures.

#### PUBLIC COMMENT

Chair Barfield called for public comment. There were four (4) members of the public present by teleconference, however, no public comment. There was also no public written testimony received for this meeting.

(Trustee Kane entered the meeting at 10:17 a.m. by joining the teleconference.)

#### EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Executive Director (ED) Williams gave an oral presentation of his report to the Board as follows:

- Presentations on the Actuarial Valuation were made in January to the Legislature, Budget & Finance, State Department Directors, Employer Meetings, Employees' Retirement System, and Hawaii Employer-Union Health Benefits Trust Fund.
- A final distribution was received for the conclusion of the sale of the Kaanapali Quarry.
- Recently hired a Chief Compliance Officer Kona Mann who will be joining ERS on February 16, 2022, and Investment Officer Operations Christine Chang will be joining ERS on March 1, 2022.
- ERS was precluded from hiring Office Assistants by the Department of Human Resources Development, however, have recently been given the approval to do so.
- Legislatively:
  - HB 2105, related to service-connected disability passed the House and is moving forward. ERS staff is working with Senate and awaiting hearings.
  - o HB 1736, related to immediate rehiring of teachers allows teachers to forego the 12-month separation requirement. This could jeopardize our tax qualification, however, ERS supports a minimum separation requirement of 3-, 6-, 9-, or 12- months.
- Received an inquiry from House Finance staff regarding our long-term plans for investment staffing as it relates to our ERS budget request submitted through Budget & Finance for an investment accounting position and technological tools for the Investment Office. House Finance staff indicated they would consider approval of additional staffing for this year. ERS staff will continue to monitor.
- Regarding employer reporting, an ERS team, coordinated by Program Specialist Shanna Sakagawa, is working with the employers to meet the requirements and avoid the penalties which might otherwise apply.

DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S OPERATIONS REPORT Deputy Executive Director (DED) Margol gave updates to the Board on ERS staffing and projects of Administration, Information Services, Retirement Benefits and Staff Support Services Branches as presented in the January 2022 Monthly Operations Report.

(Ms. Donna Curry entered the meeting at 10:37 a.m.)

Chair Barfield, on behalf of the ERS Board of Trustees, thanked Ms. Curry, a former program specialist, for her dedication and 39 years of service to the ERS. Executive Director (ED) Thomas Williams presented a Resolution on behalf of the Board of Trustees. Ms. Curry shared parting words with the Board and ERS staff attending the meeting.

Ms. Curry left the meeting after the presentation.

REPORT BY THE ADMINISTRATIVE & AUDIT COMMITTEE Administrative & Audit Committee (Committee) Chair Yap, reported to the Board that the Committee met on Wednesday, February 9, 2022, and reviewed the Administrative & Audit Committee Charter and annual performance. An edited version of the Charter will be presented to the Governance Policy Committee for acceptance and then for final approval by the Board. The Committee also reviewed its annual performance and concluded it had fulfilled its duties for the year with the guidance of former Chair Ley.

REVIEW KMH LLP's INTERNAL AUDIT UPDATE REPORT FOR ACCEPTANCE AND RECOMMENDATION TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Chair Yap then reported that KMH LLP's Internal Audit Update Report was reviewed and accepted by the Committee and was presented to the Board by Peter Hanashiro. KMH LLP's Peter Hanashiro entered the meeting by teleconference and presented an oral and written report to the Board regarding the Internal Audit Update Report and discussed:

Internal Audit Plan Update Process – 2021 Adjusted Risk Ratings 2022 Internal Audit Plan Summary

On a motion made by Trustee Yap, seconded by Trustee Mizumoto, and unanimously carried, the Board accepted the Internal Audit Update Report as recommended by the Administrative and Audit Committee.

After his presentation, Mr. Hanashiro left the meeting by exiting the teleconference.

REVIEW FINAL PROPOSED AMENDED RULES FOR CHAPTERS 6-20, 6-21, 6-22, 6-23, 6-26, AND 6-29, HAWAII ADMINISTRATIVE RULES, FOR ACCEPTANCE AND RECOMMENDATION TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES Chair Yap then reported that the Final Proposed Amended Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) for Chapters 6-20, 6-21, 6-22, 6-23, 6-26, and 6-29, were reviewed by the Committee and presented to the Board by Program Specialist (PS) Bart Asato. PS Asato presented an oral and written report to the Board regarding the final proposed amendments to HAR Chapters 6-20, 6-22, 6-23, 6-26, and 6-29, that was accepted by the Committee and requested the Board also accept the amended rules for submittal to the Governor for approval. The Committee also requested that action on Chapter 6-21 be deferred for further review and is requesting that the Board also defer.

On a motion made by Trustee Yap, seconded by Trustee Mizumoto, and unanimously carried, the Board accepted the Final Proposed Amended Hawaii Administrative Rules for Chapters 6-20, 6-22, 6-23, 6-26, and 6-29, to be submitted for Governor's approval, and that action on Chapter 6-21 be deferred for further review, as presented and recommended by the Administrative and Audit Committee.

PS Asato then presented an oral and written report to the Board on the Hawaii Domestic Relations Orders (HIDRO) Pursuant to Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) § 88-93.5, Forms and Procedures, Revised HiDRO Model Forms for Pre-Retirement (Form ERS-300) and Post-Retirement (Form ERS-301), that was accepted by the Committee and requested the Board also accept.

On a motion made by Trustee Yap, seconded by Trustee Mizumoto, and unanimously carried, the Board accepted the Revised HiDRO Model Forms

REVIEW HAWAII DOMESTIC RELATIONS ORDERS (HIDRO) PURSUANT TO HAWAII REVISED STATUTES § 88-93.5, FORMS AND PROCEDURES. REVISED HIDRO MODEL FORMS FOR PRE-RETIREMENT (FORM ERS-300) AND POST-RETIREMENT (FORM ERS-301) FOR ACCEPTANCE AND RECOMMENDATION TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES for Pre-Retirement (Form ERS-300) and Post-Retirement (Form ERS-301), as presented and recommended by the Administrative and Audit Committee.

DISCUSS BANK OF HAWAII GENERAL BANKING SERVICES CONTRACT EXTENSION Deputy Executive Director Kanoe Margol presented an oral and written report to the Board on the Bank of Hawaii General Banking Services Contract Extension for information. The contract included the option for two contract extensions, each covering a two-year period. ERS exercised its first two-year extension effective April 1, 2020, and has elected its second two-year extension effective April 1, 2022, with the same terms and conditions. The newly extended contract will expire on March 31, 2024.

DISCUSS CHIEF COMPLIANCE OFFICER ONBOARDING Chair Yap also reported to the Board that the ERS has hired a Chief Compliance Officer, Kona Man and that KMH LLP will help with onboarding. ED Williams also shared with the Board the Chief Compliance Officer's roles and responsibilities.

REPORTS BY THE COMPENSATION REVIEW, GOVERNANCE POLICY, INVESTMENT COMMITTEES Compensation Review Committee (Committee) Chair Ley, reported to the Board that the Committee met on February 10, 2022, and reviewed the Compensation Review Committee Charter and annual performance. An edited version of the Charter will be presented to the Governance Policy Committee for acceptance and then for final approval by the Board. The Committee also reviewed its annual performance and concluded it had fulfilled its duties for the year with the guidance of former Chair Rauckhorst.

Chair Ley then reported that the Committee discussed compensation for the Investment staff and that a request for proposal to procure a Compensation Study was issued. A vendor was selected for Phase I of the study that will compare compensation of Investment Office staff with a peer group of other public pension plans. The Committee approved that ERS staff proceed with a request to the Director of Finance for approval to contract, as the amount is less than ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000.00) and does not need Governor's approval. The Committee is recommending that the Board approve the request to proceed with the selected vendor for Phase I of the Compensation Study.

On a motion made by Trustee Ley, seconded by Trustee Yap, and unanimously carried, the Board approved that ERS staff proceed with a request to the Director of Finance for approval to contract with the selected vendor for Phase I of the Compensation Study, as presented and recommended by the Compensation Review Committee.

**Governance Policy Committee** (Committee) Chair Barfield reported to the Board that the Committee did not meet, however, a meeting will convene to review all of the revised Committee Charters.

**Investment Committee** (Committee) Chair Chan reported to the Board that the Committee met on January 24, 2022, and reviewed the Investment Committee Charter with no changes and its annual performance. Chair Chan also reported that she was selected as Chair and Lance Mizumoto as Vice Chair. Chair Chan further reported on a summary of the meeting that included:

PS Asato discussed with the Board, in detail, the lists of Bills previously reviewed and approved as presented consisting of: ERS Initiated, Felony Forfeiture, Benefits Related, Membership Related, Investment Related, and Miscellaneous as of February 10, 2022. The lists are attached for clarification.

The Board had no changes to the list of Bills as presented and recommended by the Legislative Committee.

ED Williams discussed with the Board, Potential Legislative Proposals Relating to the Employees' Retirement System for Future Legislation, specifically the Repeal of Act 192, SLH 2007, Sudan Investment Annual Report to the Legislature; and employers' cost associated with settlement of employee grievances equal to actuary cost of the membership service to be credited.

The Board had no comments to the Legislative proposals discussed and there were no future potential proposals suggested.

(Trustee Mizumoto exited the meeting at 11:34 a.m. by ending his teleconference.)
