A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE EXEMPTION FROM CIVIL SERVICE OF THE INFORMATION
SYSTEMS BRANCH MANAGER POSITION OF THE EMPLOYEES'
RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 88, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2 by adding a new section to part II, subpart A to be
3 appropriately designated and to read as follows:

4 "§88- Information Systems Branch Manager. The board,
5 through its executive director, may appoint an information
6 systems branch manager who shall be exempt from chapter 76 and
7 whose salary shall be fixed by the board. The appointee shall
8 serve under the direction of the deputy executive director who
9 shall prescribe their duties and qualifications."

10 SECTION 2. Section 76-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

12 "(b) The civil service to which this chapter applies shall
13 comprise all positions in the State now existing or hereafter
14 established and embrace all personal services performed for the
15 State, except the following:

16 (1) Commissioned and enlisted personnel of the Hawaii
17 National Guard and positions in the Hawaii National

- 1 Guard that are required by state or federal laws or
2 regulations or orders of the National Guard to be

Exemption;

Description:

Allows the Board of Trustees of the Employees' Retirement System, through its Executive Director, to appoint the Information Systems Branch Manger position of the Employees' Retirement System of the State of Hawaii and exempts that position from the State's civil service requirements.

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: BUDGET AND FINANCE

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE EXEMPTION FROM CIVIL SERVICE OF INFORMATION SYSTEMS BRANCH MANAGER POSITION, OF THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

PURPOSE: To allow the Board of Trustees of the Employees' Retirement System (ERS Board), through its Executive Director, to appoint the Information Systems Branch Manager position of the Employees' Retirement System of Hawaii, and to exempt this position from the State's civil service requirements.

MEANS: Add a new section to subpart A of Part II of chapter 88, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), and amend section 76-16(b), HRS.

JUSTIFICATION: The ERS is a specialized public pension system responsible for administering retirement benefits for eligible State and county employees and retirees throughout Hawai'i. The System's operations depend extensively on secure, reliable, and continuously available information technology infrastructure and applications. ERS currently serves more than 160,000 members, including active members, retirees and beneficiaries, and inactive members.

The Information Systems Branch Manager position is uniquely situated at the intersection of technology, cybersecurity, data protection, financial operations, and public-sector retirement administration. The specialized knowledge required, the sensitivity of the information under the position's responsibility, the competitive IT labor market, and the mission-critical nature of ERS's technology environment justify providing the System with greater flexibility in recruiting and retaining qualified personnel.

Accordingly, the Information Systems Branch Manager position should be exempt from the State's civil service requirements. Such an exemption would allow ERS to respond more effectively to rapidly changing technology needs, compete for specialized IT talent, protect sensitive member information, maintain continuity of critical operations, and fulfill its fiduciary and administrative responsibilities to the members and beneficiaries of the ERS.

QUORUM/CALL TO ORDER

A quorum being present (Chair Chan, Vice Chair Kane, and Trustees Barfield and Colby), Chair Chan called the meeting of the Legislative Committee (Committee) of the Board of Trustees (Board) of the Employees' Retirement System of the State of Hawaii (ERS) to order at 1:00 p.m. and requested each Trustee identify themselves and confirm that they are the only ones present at their remote location while attending the meeting. Each of the Trustees present confirmed same. Chair Chan reminded the Committee to please be sure that they are visible on their video cameras and that they remain on while the meeting is in session.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Chair Chan called for public comment. There was no public attending in person and two (2) public attending by teleconference with no public comment. There was also no written public testimony received for this Committee meeting.

Executive Director (ED) Kalbert Young and Program Specialist (PS) James Greubel presented and discussed with the Committee an Update of the Legislative Bills which may impact the Employees' Retirement System for the 2026 Legislative Session and reviewed the list of active or dead ERS Initiated, Membership and Benefits Related, and Miscellaneous 2026 Legislative Bills. (An updated list, other than what was distributed, was presented to the Committee and is attached to these minutes for clarification.)

PS Greubel shared with the Committee that regarding GM 634, Board of Trustees of the ERS, Trustee Darlene Blakeney was unanimously confirmed by the Senate

for a term to expire January 1, 2032. Also, the Director of Department of Budget and Finance and Board of Trustee (Ex Officio) Seth Colby was to be voted on and confirmed by the Senate on May 6, 2026.

ED Young shared with the Committee that regarding HB 1800, HD1, SD1/SB2500, State Budget, Executive Supplemental Budget, the Bill is set for a floor vote by the Legislature possibly on May 6, 2026, as it relates to ERS the operating appropriation for FY2027 has been amended to \$29,378,766M for 118 authorized FTE positions. This is a reduced amount to what is appropriated for the current FY2026 of \$30,773,357, but is an increase in the amount that was originally appropriated in the biennium budget for FY2027 of \$25,727,960. ED Young further shared with the Committee that ERS will await the budget worksheets as to budget decisions for any changes.

Chair Chan presented to the Committee a request to Identify and Discuss Potential Legislative Proposals Determined to be Necessary or Desirable for the System's Investments, Administration, and/or Operations. The Committee had no suggested Potential Legislative Proposals for the Employees' Retirement System for the 2027 Legislative session.

ED Young asked the Committee for ideas for measures possibly from bills from this past session and if none, further discussions could be done in future Committee meetings by late summer to early fall, August to September, for next Legislative session. ED Young shared with the Committee that after the session concludes, ERS staff will look at this past session and see if there are any ideas for next session.

The Committee did not have any ideas, at the moment, and agreed to discuss at future Committee meetings.
